2014 U.S.A. JET RIVER RACING SERIES WON BY AMERICAN TEAM FROM POST FALLS, IDAHO

The American Power Boat Association has announced American driver Ross Schlotthauer, piloting 'Bat Outta Hell' has won the coveted U.S.A. Jet River Racing Series for 2014; driving a hull created by Bratt Jet of Sylan Lake, Alberta, Canada and modified by Schlotthauer's company, Burly Racing located in Post Falls, Idaho.

Schlotthauer, 38-years-old, and navigator Chad Yackel, 40-years-old, of Spokane Valley, Wash., finished with the best overall time of 3 hours, 56.47 minutes.

"We raced over 1,000 river miles this year and finished 30 legs without a breakdown," Schlotthauer said. "Our best speed we hit was 143 MPH."

"We broke on Leg 31 with 100 miles left in the U.S.A. series, trying out a new set up to prepare for the 2015 World Jet Boat Marathon in Canada."

The U.S.A. Jet River Racing Series was comprised of three jet boat river races on the Salmon, St. Joe and Snake rivers in Idaho. Schlotthauer's jet boat #377 raced in the Unlimited jet river class of turbine engines. This is the team's fourth year of jet boat racing.
